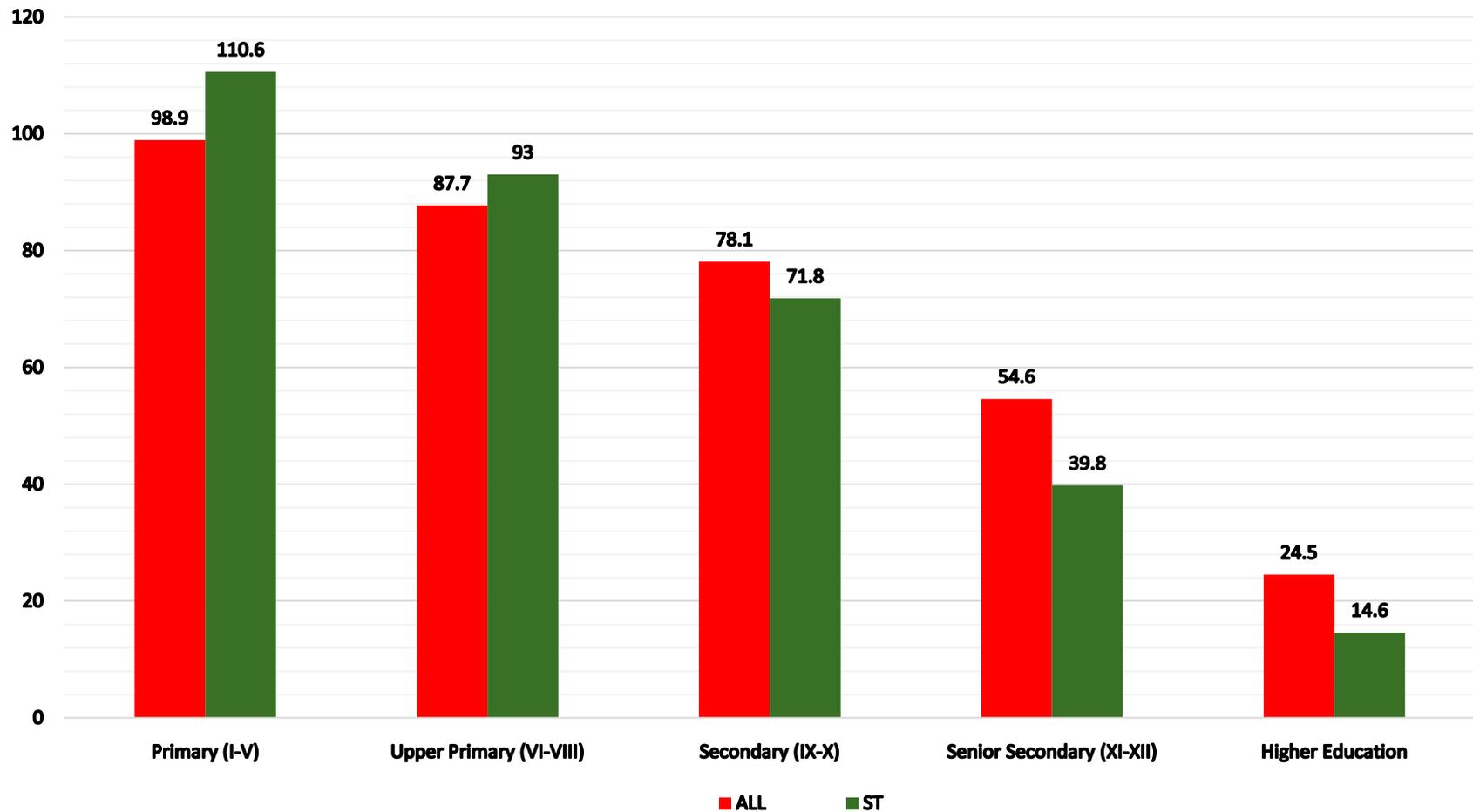

Status of ST Education

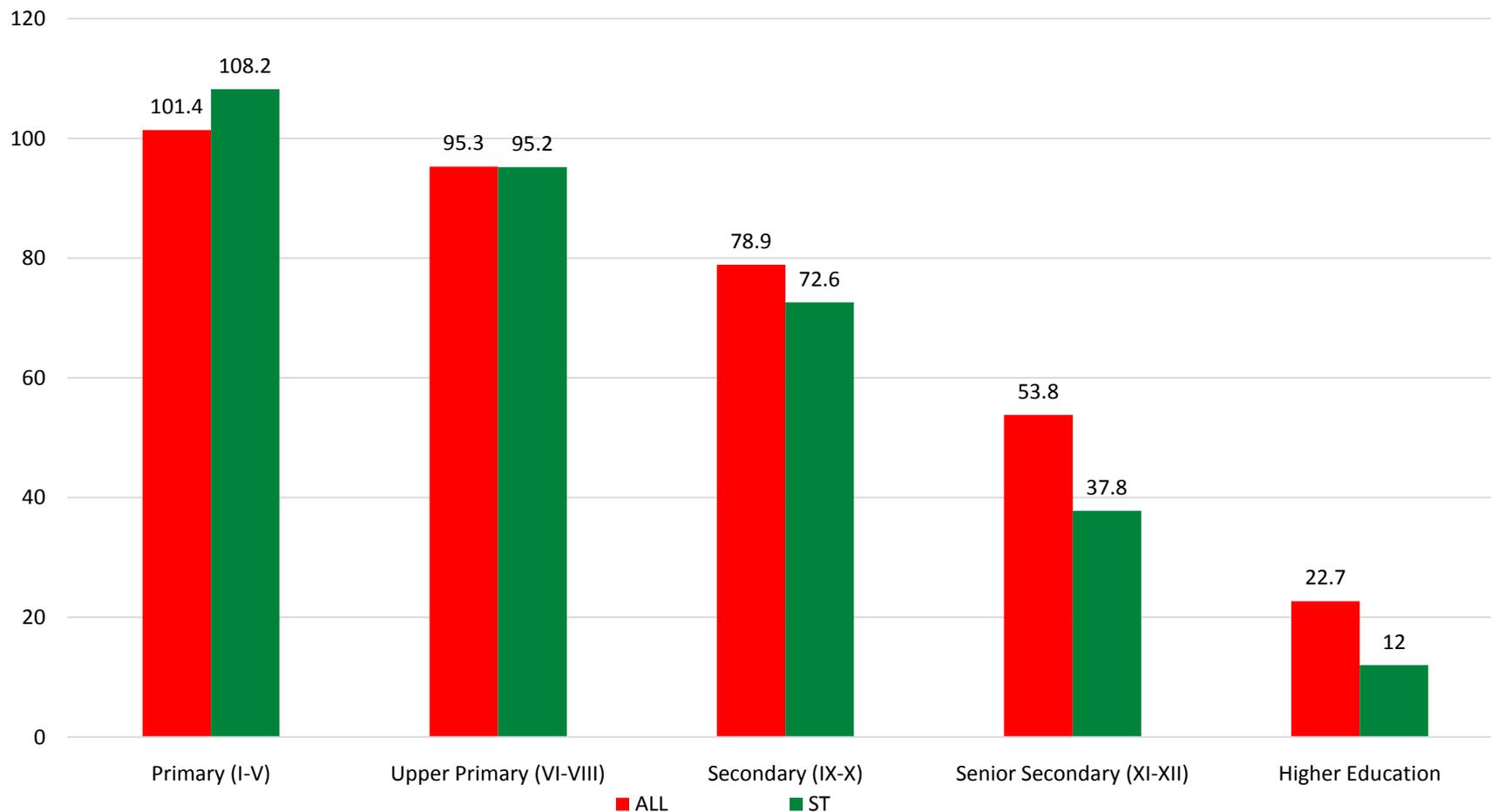

GROSS ENROLMENT RATIO (GER) - Boys



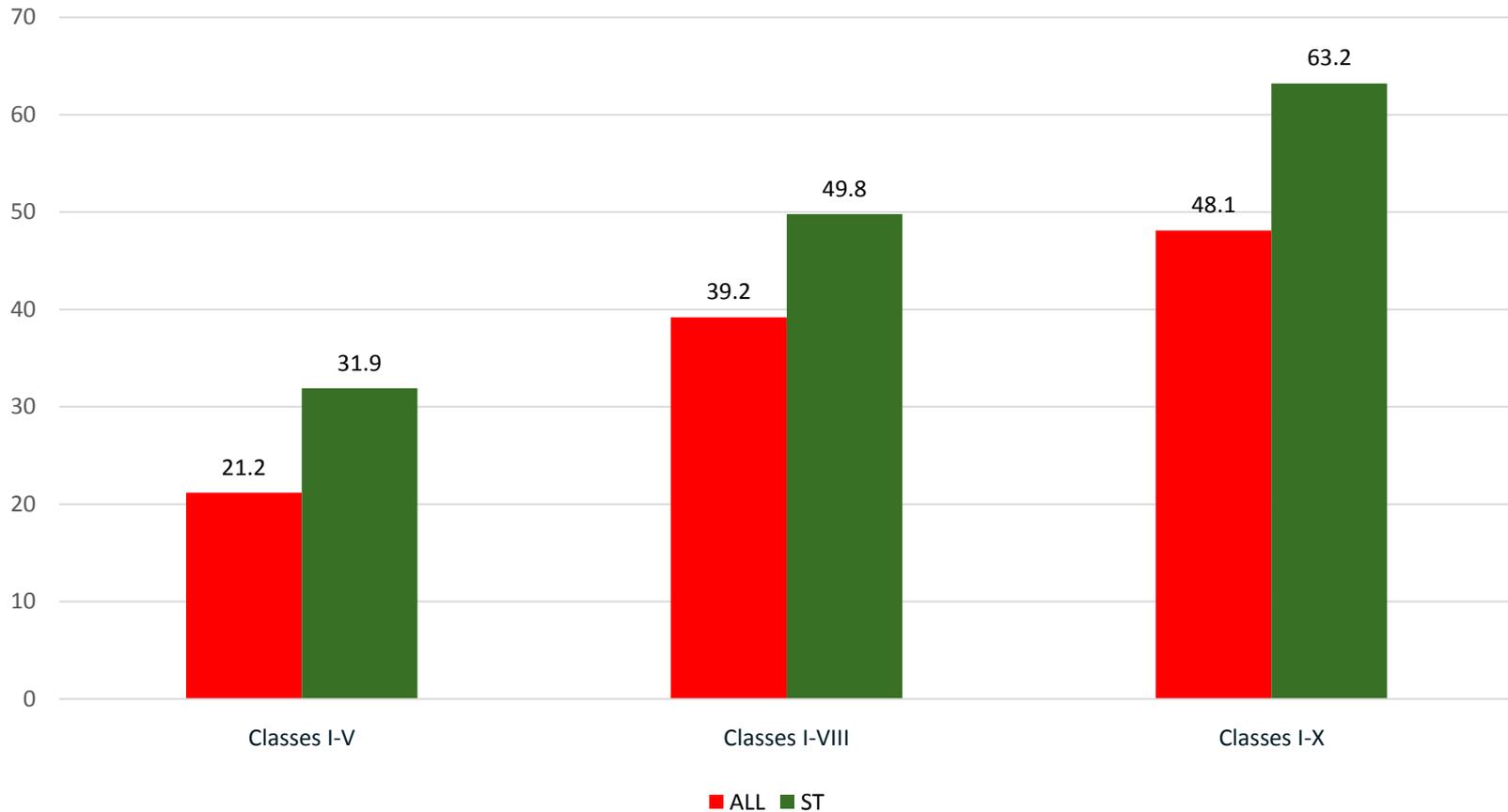
$$\text{GER} = \frac{\text{Total Enrolment}}{\text{Population of relevant age group in years}} * 100$$

GROSS ENROLMENT RATIO (GER) - Girls



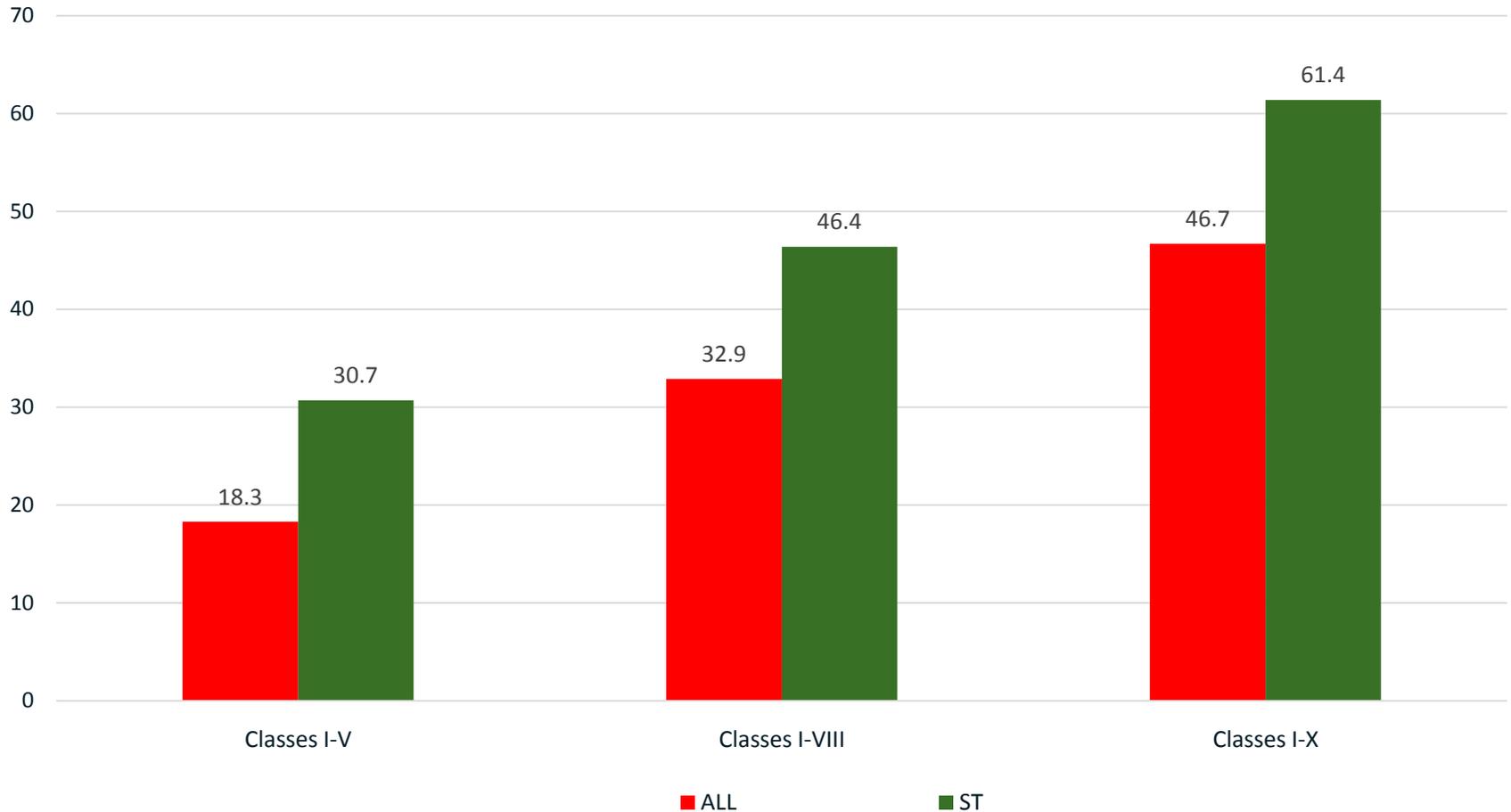
$$\text{GER} = \frac{\text{Total Enrolment}}{\text{Population of relevant age group in years}} * 100$$

Drop-Out Rates for Boys



Dropout Rate = $100 - \frac{(\text{Enrolment in terminal grade} - \text{Repeaters in terminal grade})}{\text{Enrolment in initial grade}} * 100$

Drop-Out Rates for Girls



Dropout Rate = $100 - \frac{(\text{Enrolment in terminal grade} - \text{Repeaters in terminal grade})}{\text{Enrolment in initial grade}} * 100$

Issues & Concerns related to Education of STs

- Low literacy rate
- High dropout rate
- Out of school children
- Vacant post of teachers in Tribal Areas
- Low learning outcomes
- Shortage of Secondary / Sr Secondary Schools and Colleges with Science stream
- Malnutrition and Anemia of ST students
- Hygiene and sanitation in Ashram Schools
- Physical Safety and Security of girl students in Residential Ashram Schools and Hostels

Education related Schemes for STs

For Critical Gap Filling :

- Establishment of Ashram Schools in TSP areas
- Eklavya Model Residential Schools (EMRS)
- Construction of hostels for ST Girls and Boys
- Vocational Training Centers in tribal areas
- Strengthening education among ST girls in low literacy districts
- Grant-in-aid to voluntary organization working for educational development and welfare of STs

For Critical Gap Filling

-contd.

- **Scholarships :**
 - Pre-matric scholarship for ST students (Class IX, X)
 - Post-matric scholarship for ST student (Class XI onwards)
 - Up-gradation of merit of ST children
 - Top-Class Education for ST students
 - National Fellowships
 - National overseas scholarships
- Aadhaar linked Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) through National Scholarship Portal (NSP 2.0) directly to ST students.
- Zero – fee based admission to be ensured.

Educational Scenario

- 6.38 lakh + villages in 240,355 GPs (under 6,317 blocks), in 651 districts.
- UDISE (2014-15)
- Pry. Schools - 1207,427 (1.89 per village)
- UP Schools - 561,202 (85% villages covered)
- Sec. Schools - 175,000 in rural areas (total 233,517)
(less than 1 per GP)
- Hr. Sec. Schools - 54,659 in rural areas (of total 109,318)
(> 75 % of GPs are not covered)

Deficits in Educational Facilities

- Primary Schools > No. of Revenue Villages
Even 85% villages are covered by upper primary schools.

Objectives:

- (1) Secondary schools (1 per Gram Panchayat immediately)
- (2) Sr. Secondary schools (1 per Gram Panchayat within 2-3 years)
- (3) Teacher Availability
- (4) Sr. Secondary Science Teaching (1 per adjacent G.P.)
- (5) Quality schooling facility
- (6) Medium of Teaching as per market needs

Eklavya Model Residential School (EMRS)

- Funding under Article 275 (1)
 - Capital cost Rs. 12 Cr. in plain, Rs. 16 Cr. in difficult and hilly areas
 - Rs. 42,000 p. a./student for recurring costs
- Position: Sanctioned - 227, Functional- 137

Challenges:

- Stipend for students from 2016-17 academic year, under DBT to ST students.
- Outcome Evaluation.
- Shortage of teachers.

Ashram Schools & Hostels

Ashram Schools

- GoI funded Ashram Schools 1,205
- State Government funded 3,272
- 4,477
- Of GoI < 50 hostels for Higher Secondary Schools.
- State Govt. 5 to 10 % only

Hostels for ST Boys / Girls

GoI funded schools -	2,073
State Government funded -	<u>16,000</u>
	<u>18,073</u>

Hostels are not supported with existence of school facility.

Recent initiatives

- Guidelines for SCA to TSP and Grants under proviso to Article 275(1) revised in June, 2016
- Priority to education with overall allocation of 40-50%
- Disbursement of Scholarships in DBT mode to Aadhaar seeded bank account of beneficiaries through NSP 2.0
- Vanbandhu Kalyan Yojana (VKY) with a focus on quality and higher education through convergence.
- Focus on tribal concentrated districts to improve access to secondary /sr. secondary and higher education.
- Scope of Education expanded to include sports and vocational education.

Action Points

- (1) All existing hostels / Ashram Schools should have access in neighbourhood (preferably in same village)
- (2) Science curriculum at Sr. Secondary Level ensuring access to it within next G.P.
- (3) 1 Kendriya Vidyalaya in each of 177 ST priority districts
- (4) 2 Navodaya Vidyalaya (NVs) in districts $\geq 50\%$ ST Population
and 1 Navodaya Vidyalaya in districts $\geq 25\%$ ST Population
Within 1-2 years.
2 NVs in district $\geq 25\%$ ST population in next 3 years.
- (5) English as medium of instruction at least at one block level school to meet market demand for employability.

Action Points (2)

- (6) College Education Facility in every revenue Sub-Division (in PPP mode, if so required)
 - (a) with $> 50\%$ ST population (in 1-2 years) and
 - (b) with $> 25\%$ ST population (in 3 years)

- (7) Hosting School lessons (in Math, Sc. and English to start with) in local dialects also to meet teacher deficit.

- (8) Disbursal of all scholarships through NSP 2.0 and DBT mode to Aadhaar seeded bank accounts of Beneficiaries from 2016-17

Action Points (3)

(9) Scheme for Talent - nurturing with

- Optional School examination from Class IV and onwards (in Sc. & Math to start with)
(Scholar > 90% - 95% score,
Distinction > 75% marks)
- Incentive in terms of admission to any Public School (Pvt. School) (under RTE Act) with Govt. funding.
- Other incentives to motivate students in immediate neighbourhood.
- Performance as yardstick for evaluation of teachers' performance.
